Course Title: Courage Under Fire: Being the Best Fire Service Professional you can be in 2021 & Beyond!

#### Course Description:

This session is intended for all ranks of fire service personnel (current and aspiring) -firefighter up to fire chief. Some may say we have a leadership crisis in today's fire service, not to mention the World in general. I also think it could be argued that we may also have a followership crisis in today's fire service, as well as the World in general.
